Protect Your Health

You might be surprised to know that the air freshener industry uses over 3000 synthetic chemicals as ingredients in the air fresheners you use everyday. Some of the most commonly used ingredients are:

- Formaldehyde
- Phthalates known as DEP and DBP
- Petroleum Distillates
- Para dichlorobenzene
- Aerosol propellants

Those words do not sound very appealing or "fresh".



Most of these "ingredients" have been shown to cause cancer in humans.

- **Formaldehyde:** causes irritation of the eyes and mucous membranes; inhalation may cause headaches, a burning sensation in the throat, and difficulty breathing, as well as triggering or aggravating asthma symptoms.
- **Phthalates:** cause damage to the liver, kidneys, lungs, and developing testes.
- **Petroleum Distillates:** cause irritation of eyes, nose, throat; dizziness, drowsiness; headache; nausea; dry cracked skin; chemical pneumonitis (from aspiration of liquid).
- **Para dichlorobenzene (also called 1,4-Dichlorobenzene, p-DCB, etc):** causes dizziness, headaches, and liver problems.
- **Propellants (usually Butane, Isobutene or Propane):** inhaling butane can cause drowsiness, narcosis, asphyxia, cardiac arrhythmia and frostbite, which can result in instant death from asphyxiation, acute toxicity and ventricular fibrillation.

Protect Your Family

Research shows that air fresheners are linked to many health problems:

- **32% more babies** suffer **diarrhea** in homes where air fresheners are used every day, compared with homes where they are used once a week or less, and they have **significantly more earaches** in these homes as well.
- Air fresheners also affect **mothers**—those who use them daily suffered nearly **10% more headaches**.
- Women who live in homes with daily air freshener use have a **26% increased risk of depression**.
- Homes where air fresheners are used regularly also have a higher rate of occupants inflicted with **asthma, allergies, and cancers**.
